Just Cause Eviction 1-8-19

Just Cause Eviction (JCE): Community Process and Interim Ordinance (CA/CM/PL)

At the January 8, 2019 city council meeting - **recommendation**: Introduce for publication an interim ordinance requiring just cause for tenant evictions within the City of Santa Cruz, to be effective during a complementary community process.

Motion directing staff regarding the goals, anticipated outcomes, and preferred community process on the topic of tenant protections from evictions without cause and other relevant measures.
